

Some tips for your stay in Montevideo

In this document we would like to share some recommendations on places and activities to enjoy your stay in Montevideo. The list is not exhaustive, obviously, but you can consult us in case you want our opinion or help on something that is not here.

Places to eat or have a drink.

There is a wide gastronomic offer in Montevideo, but here are some representative places. We looked for places near the event venue or in the circuits you may want to visit.

Outdoor activities:

Montevideo has more than 20km of promenade and along it you can appreciate different landscapes. A good way to get around it is by bicycle, so we leave you this contact in case you want to rent one to do it: [Orange Bike](#). If you are close to the venue, they can bring you the bike.

On Sundays, from 9 a.m. until around 4 p.m., there is a typical walk in the city which is the "Feria de Tristan Narvaja" (street market). There you can find everything from antiques to seasonal fruits. In addition, along this street there are many bookshops and bars to hang out in. The starting point is [here](#).

The historic centre of Montevideo has a great number of attractions, and you have the possibility of joining a walking tour to visit it. On this [website](#) you can find different options according to your interests.

Next to the venue of the event is the “[Parque Rodó](#)”, which is one of the main parks of the city. The park has a lake, several monuments, information on plant species, a photo exhibition, among other attractions. Next to the Confucius statue you can enjoy one of the best sunset views in the city.

Getting around Montevideo:

If you arrive by plane from [Carrasco International Airport](#), you have **several options** to get to the city centre. The cheapest alternative is to take a suburban bus from the airport to Terminal Tres Cruces and, from there, public transport to your hotel. Taking a taxi (check fares) or getting an Uber is also possible at the airport.

If you arrive [by ferry](#), it is possible to use urban public transport and go directly to your hotel. In this case, the taxi option is more accessible than arriving at the airport.

If you arrive [by bus](#) from the Tres Cruces bus terminal, you can take public transport anywhere in the city.

In all cases, you will have updated information on public transport lines and estimated taxi fares using Google Maps.

It is important to keep in mind that you will have to pay in cash for public transport (there is a card, but it is not easy to get one). In most taxis, you can pay by card, but it is important to ask the driver before you start your journey.
